News from Mary Jane and Andris

Good day, family, friends, and partners in ministry!

It is drizzly day here in Haiti. We are starting to have some rain after about 4 months of dryness.

We continue to push ahead in spite of the insecurity and unstable political situation in Haiti. We remain in very troubled times with lots of uncertainty, but we believe God will intervene in His divine timing, which isn't always our timing. It is still incredibly problematic to get to Port-au-Prince through the gang-controlled areas. We stay busy at the mission with the ministry, and continue to pray for safety and protection for all the staff, students, and everyone in Haiti.

This is a rough year for many of the students and their families due to the continued raising inflation rate (at 48% in March). Crime and violence is up 80% already this year.

We opened the primary school for the new school year in January and are pushing forward. We are giving very few days off due to the number of school days we have already had to miss. The students are scheduled to have classes through the end of August. Then the new school year is to begin the 1st week of September!

The Trade School classes also opened entirely in January. The students and staff are present on extra days due to all the missed days/months. They come in as they can. Our students in the trade school always go throughout the summer months and end in August. We continue to assess the political situation, gang activity, and general climate in Haiti (especially in our area). The government exams have already been rescheduled 3 times this year, and now they are scheduled the 1st week of August.

We just got the final results of the government trade school licensure exams from last year. Great news! 100 % of cooking and sewing students passed, and 98 % of the business students passed.

Mary Jane has one new cooking textbook to write for June. Then she will finalize all corrections and changes for the upcoming school year and turn the cooking books over to the cooking teachers.

Supplies are still very limited; often there is no gas, diesel, or propane in our area and limited grocery store and construction items. We had city electricity for less than 2 hours in March and none in April (so far). For several grocery items, we buy everything when we see it because it may be 4 months or longer before we find it again. It is the same with fuel and construction supplies. Also, the next time we do find things, you can be assured the price will be inflated much more. This makes shopping very difficult.

We are happy and blessed to report that the damaged wall repair is finished, and the new perimeter wall is done. (Please see the video on our website.) Currently we are working and progressing on the gathering center. The foundation, support posts, and walls are done. Now they are preparing the roof beams, and then the roof can be poured. Andris has been 100% occupied with construction, church services, Bible Studies, and the overall supervision.

News from Mary Jane and Andris (cont.)

We were asked by our Board of Directors: What are your goals for 2023? These are our goals:

- 1. To provide safety and security for our students and staff as they pursue receiving an education and advancing themselves.
- 2. To continue to give a high-quality education to every student: spiritually, intellectually, socially, and physically by providing daily devotions in classes, weekly chapel services, Haitian curriculum, music classes, English, and hands on classes (Paper Art, Canvas Art, Shop, Basic Sewing, Embroidery, Cooking, Crocheting, and String Art.)
- 3. To enable and assist the Primary School Directrice and Principles to direct and run the primary school without our assistance, making them independent in the decision making. We are encouraging them to do weekly teacher training classes and have Parent-Teacher meetings every control period.
- 4. To assist the Trade School Secretary and teachers to function more independently and continue to produce a high-quality education for the students.
- 5. To support and encourage our Music Director, who is now checking the teacher lesson plans, correcting the curriculums, overseeing the teachers, receiving the grades, and overseeing chapel services.
- 6. To provide teachers with training seminars, appreciation luncheons, and encouragement in giving 100% to their students and classes.
- 7. To provide the primary school students with a science lab and computer lab in the future.

Our most important goal is to honor Christ in all of our activities and behaviors. To that end, we continue to teach about Christian character and living.

Andris was a great help with understanding of the Haitian culture and ways. Our daughters, Mary and Hope, worked with some of the girls to teach them about dance as worship, and worked together with them on a dance to a worship song that they shared as an offering to the Lord during Sunday worship.

During both of our trips, I was struck again and again by the grace of God in the lives of Mary Jane and Andris as they rely on Him for direction, protection, provision, and empowerment from the Holy Spirit to get up and 5 am and go and serve and keep going and serving until late at night with joy, gratitude, love, patience, and perseverance. Jesus, the Gospel, prayer, and Bible study are front and center in all they do. I praise God for them and the lasting fruit that God is producing through them in the lives of Haitians for His glory.

Just look at the picture above. The final portions of the outer wall, started so many years ago, is finally complete! God provided the funds, building materials, and laborers to make it happen. The hole broken in the wall behind the church is fixed and the wall has been reinforced with new strength. The new Gathering Center is under construction and will provide a safe shelter for many activities and Bible studies. Even though the electricity and internet has been spotty, we were able to host our first Zoom gathering with Mary Jane and Andris. Our supporters were able to see them, talk with them, and ask their own questions. The school is open and functioning at full capacity, and Church services have never had to stop. The students, staff, and families have all been safe as they come and go. God continues to richly bless Living Hope Ministries in Haiti. Please continue to pray with us for a another new normal to begin: one of peace and safety for all of Haiti, for the violence to stop, and all eyes to turn to God.
